Dear UCCS Honors Program's Faculty, Mentors and Community: We are honoring all our recent Fall 2023 graduates: Hanna Hesse, Kathryn Shoemaker, and Sanam Waintrub.

Starting Spring 2024, UCCS-Honors Program will offer guidance to all its cohorts towards pursuing graduate studies. Dr. Karen deVries will the POC for all 14 UCCS AMP programs. Dr. Kuzma and Ms. Carol Pina will also assist Dr. deVries. UCCS-HP will also partner with UCCS-ICORE (Interdisciplinarity & Complexity Oriented Researchers and Educators) and leverage GMI program's focus on Complex Systems to provide both MSCS-GMI<sup>1</sup> and PhD opportunities to qualified UCCS-HP cohorts seeking graduate studies program in Gray Matters and Complex Systems. 30% of all GMI Program graduates' thesis work is on Complex Systems<sup>2</sup>.

Dr. Susan Taylor to provide CU-development guidance. (ii) ICORE-Marine & Wild-Life (POC: Ms. Carol with Drs. deVries and Semwal assisting) (iii) Honors Program HUB's TinyHomes (POC: Dr. Kuzma) and ICORE's Computational Empathy initiative (POC: ICORE members Drs. Pina-Thomas, Philips and Semwal assisting), (iv) ICORE-SOUTHWEST Gray Matters Education initiative (POC: Dr. Semwal with all HP Faculty assisting including Dr. Sackett on sabbatical from UCCS-HP).

In Summer 2024, UCCS-Honors Program will participate in UCCS-ICORE Fourth Symposium and introduce its first Gray Matters and Complex Systems Film Focus Series by offering two movies on Gray Matters after the conference.
